RESPIRATORY TRACT: The right lung weighs 600 grams, the left lung weighs 400 grams. There is some congestion. The pulmonary parenchyma is otherwise unremarkable. The pulmonary arteries, larynx, trachea and bronchi are unremarkable.

GASTROINTESTINAL TRACT: The esophagus is normal. The stomach contains approximately 100 cc's of brown partially digested food particles. The gastric mucosa is unremarkable. The remainder of the gastrointestinal tract is within normal limits. There is a long retrocecal appendix. The liver is 4400 grams of normal configuration, medium red-brown color without fibrosis and has normal architecture on cut section. There are severe linear tears extending from the retroperitoneum anteriorly on the mesentery of the small bowel. These tears include torn vessels and are obviously the source of the retroperitoneal bleeding. The gallbladder contains approximately 10 cc's of yellow-green bile. The pancreas is unremarkable.


GENITOURINARY TRACT: There is a horseshoe kidney weighing 400 grams. The capsule strip with ease. The cortical surfaces are smooth and shiny. The kidney is a red-brown color with normal architecture on cut section. The urinary bladder is empty of urine. The prostate is normal. The genitalia are normal circumcised adult male. The spleen is 500 grams. The capsule is smooth and glistening. The spleen is a dark rose-red color of fibrous consistency without injury. The adrenals and thyroid are normal.

HEAD: There is an abrasion of the scalp as previously described.

DIAGNOSIS: Exogenous obesity, residual of pericarditis, horseshoe kidney, hemoperitoneum with laceration of small bowel mesentery, descending thoracic aortic tear, possible vertebral skull fracture with atlantal occipital dislocation.


CAUSE OF DEATH: Multiple traumatic injuries.

TIME OF DEATH: Minutes.
