EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:

The body is identified by toe tags and is that of an unembalmed refrigerated adult male who appears the reported age of 26 years. The body measures 67 inches, weighs 159 pounds, and is normally developed. Hydration and nutritional status are grossly normal. Examination of the skin no evidence of jaundice. Scars: not identified. Tattoos: (numerous present with only a select few described) left lateral aspect of neck rose, mid upper chest 'No Woman No Cry', lateral aspect of right deltoid Einstein face with tongue out, mid chest bird like symbol, right axilla 'Most Dope' with tragedy/comedy masks, right axilla Pennsylvania with star on localization of Pittsburgh, left bicep Marilyn Monroe in red dress being pushed up, left axilla clock, mid abdomen 'We are confused', anterior aspect of left forearm 'Only so much time left in this crazy world', anterior aspect of right wrist 'Beats rhymes and left', right shin alien riding spaceship, right shin boxing kangaroo,

left shin flames with woman, left upper back persons face wearing glasses, posterior neck globe, right upper back balloon with person in canoe, posterior aspect of right forearm John Lennon face, posterior aspect of right hand 'P' in the style of the Pittsburgh Pirates. Rigor mortis is absent. Livor mortis is fixed and anterior of the upper face.

The head is normal in size and shape. The scalp hair is brown. There is no temporal or vertex balding. Mustache is present. Beard is present. Examination of the eyes reveals irides that appear to be hazel and sclerae that are white. The conjunctivae are not congested. The oronasal passages are unobstructed. There is no foam in the nares or oral cavity. There is patchy bright red blood of the right nares with no evidence of septal perforation. Upper and lower teeth are present. Frenulae and oral mucosa are intact.

There is no chest deformity. There is no increased anterior-posterior diameter. The abdomen is unremarkable. The genitalia are those of an adult male. The external genitalia are without trauma or lesions.

EVIDENCE OF THERAPEUTIC INTERVENTION:

There is no evidence of recent therapeutic intervention. Recent needle punctures are not identified. There has not been post mortem intervention for organ procurement.

POST MORTEM CHANGES:

None identified.

EVIDENCE OF TRAUMATIC INJURY:

Blunt trauma, head

INITIAL INCISION:

The body cavities are entered through the standard coronal incision and the standard Y-shaped incision. No foreign material is present in the mouth, upper airway, and trachea.

NECK:

The neck organs are removed en bloc with the tongue. There is no edema of the larynx. There is froth with a pink tinge of the trachea and larynx. Both hyoid bone and larynx are intact and without fractures. No hemorrhage is present in the adjacent throat organs investing fascia, strap muscles, thyroid, or visceral fascia. There are no prevertebral fascial hemorrhages. The tongue when sectioned shows no trauma.

CHEST/ABDOMINAL CAVITY:

Pleural effusions are absent. Pleural fibrous adhesions are absent. The parietal pleurae are intact. Soft tissues of the thoracic and abdominal walls are well-preserved. The organs of the abdominal cavity have a normal arrangement and none are absent. Ascites is not present. The peritoneal cavity is without evidence of peritonitis. There are no adhesions.

SYSTEMIC AND ORGAN REVIEW:

Note: The following observations are limited to findings other than injuries, if described above.

MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM:

No abnormalities of the uninjured bony framework or muscles are identified.

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM:

The thoracic and abdominal aorta have no atherosclerosis. There is no tortuosity or widening of the thoracic segment. There is no dilation of the lower abdominal segment. No aneurysm is present. The major branches of the aorta show no abnormality.

Within the pericardial sac there is a minimal amount of serous fluid.

The heart weighs 300 grams. It has a normal configuration. cardiac silhouette is not globular and the myocardium is not flabby. The right ventricle is 0.3 cm, the interventricular septum is 1 cm in thickness, and the left ventricle is 1 cm in thickness. The chambers are normally developed and are without mural thrombosis. The valves are thin, leafy, and competent. No cardiac valve vegetations are present. There is no endocardial discoloration. There is no abnormality of the apices of the papillary musculature. There are no defects of the septum. The great vessels enter and leave in a normal fashion. The ductus arteriosus cannot be probed. The coronary ostia are patent, located at or below the sinotubular junction and are relatively centrally located within their respective sinuses. The coronary artery distribution is right dominant. Serial sectioning of the coronary arteries show no atherosclerosis.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM:

Scant secretions are found in the upper respiratory and lower bronchial passages. The mucosa is intact and pale. The right lung weighs 850 grams and the left lung weighs 700 grams. There is predominant anterior lung surfaces congestion. The pulmonary parenchyma is dark red-purple and the cut surfaces exude a moderate amount of blood and frothy fluid. The visceral pleurae are smooth and intact. The pulmonary vasculature is without thromboembolism. There is no evidence of pulmonary infarction.

GASTROINTESTINAL SYSTEM:

The esophagus is intact throughout. Esophageal varices are not present. The stomach contains no food or liquid. The mucosa is unremarkable. The small intestine and colon are unremarkable. The appendix is present. The pancreas occupies a normal position. There is no necrosis or trauma. There is no evidence of pancreatic fibrosis or of pancreatitis.

HEPATOBILIARY SYSTEM:

The liver weighs 1700 grams, and is red-brown. The capsule is intact and the consistency of the parenchyma is firm. The cut surface is smooth. There is no evidence of cirrhosis. There is a normal lobular arrangement. The gallbladder is present. The wall is thin and pliable. It contains a moderate amount of bile and no calculi.

URINARY SYSTEM:

The right kidney weighs 200 grams and the left kidney weighs 200 grams. The kidneys are normally situated and the capsules strip easily revealing a surface that is smooth and glistening. The corticomedullary demarcation is preserved. The pyramids are not remarkable. The peripelvic fat is not increased. The ureters are without dilation or obstruction and pursue their normal course. The urinary bladder is unremarkable. It contains approximately 370 cc of yellow urine. The urine is positive for cocaine.

GENITAL SYSTEM:

The prostate is not enlarged and is without nodularity. Both testes are in the scrotum and are unremarkable and without trauma.

HEMOLYMPHATIC SYSTEM:

The spleen weighs 300 grams. The capsule is intact. The parenchyma is dark red and soft. There is no increased follicular pattern. The bone is not remarkable. The bone marrow of the rib is unremarkable.

ENDOCRINE SYSTEM:

The thyroid, adrenal, and pituitary glands are unremarkable. The parathyroid glands are not identified. The thymus is the usual appearance for the age.

SPECIAL SENSES:

The eyes are not dissected. The middle and inner ear are not dissected.

HEAD AND CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM:

There is no subcutaneous, subgaleal, or subperiosteal hemorrhage in the scalp. The external periosteum and dura mater are stripped showing no fractures of the calvarium or base of the skull. There are no tears of the dura mater. There is no epidural, subdural or subarachnoid hemorrhage.

The brain weighs 1500 grams. The leptomeninges are thin and transparent. A normal convolutionary pattern is observed. Coronal sectioning demonstrates a uniformity of cortical gray thickness. The cerebral hemispheres are symmetrical. There is no softening, discoloration, or hemorrhage of the white matter. The basal ganglia are intact. Anatomic landmarks are preserved. Cerebral contusions are not present. The ventricular system has a normal appearance without dilation or distortion. Pons, medulla, and cerebellum are unremarkable. There is no evidence of uncal or cerebellar herniation. Vessels at the base of the brain have a normal pattern of distribution. There are no aneurysms. The cerebral arteries are without arteriosclerosis.

SPINAL CORD:

The cord is not dissected.

EVIDENCE COLLECTION:

No evidence collected.

HISTOLOGIC SECTIONS:

Representative sections from various organs are preserved in one storage jar.

Samples of heart blood, femoral blood, urine, bile, and vitreous are submitted to the laboratory. An EDTA tube is collected for blood typing.

SPECIAL PROCEDURES:

None.

PHOTOGRAPHY:

Photographs have been taken prior to and during the course of the autopsy.

RADIOLOGY:

No radiologic examination performed.

WITNESSES:

There were no witnesses.

DIAGRAMS USED:

Diagram forms #20, and 22 were used during the performance of the autopsy. Coroner diagrams are not intended to be facsimiles nor are they drawn to scale.

SUMMARY & OPINION:

This 26 year old man, Malcolm James Meyers McCormick, died of mixed drug toxicity (fentanyl, cocaine, and ethanol).

According to reports, Mr. McCormick was found face down and unresponsive in a residence. Paramedics arrived and pronounced him dead at the scene.

Autopsy revealed pulmonary edema (fluid buildup in lungs), and froth of the upper airways. There was an abrasion of the nose with blood of the right nostril.

Post mortem (after death) toxicology detected fentanyl, cocaine, and ethanol (see separate report).

Fentanyl is a central nervous system depressant with high potential for abuse. It can slow the breathing rate and cause sudden death.

Ethanol is a central nervous system depressant that also slows the breathing rate, and therefore also contributed to death.

Cocaine is a central nervous system stimulant with high potential for abuse. At any concentration it can cause an arrhythmia (lethal heart rhythm) and sudden death.


The manner of death is accident.






Investigation:

On 09/07/2018 at 1232 hours Officer Simon from the Los Angeles Police Department North Hollywood Division called C. Tardie at the Los Angeles County Department of Medical Examiner-Coroner to report this apparent accidental versus natural death. It was reported that the decedent was discovered unresponsive on his bed by his personal assistant. The decedent was described to be in a "praying position" with fluid excreting from the mouth. The personal assistant performed cardiopulmonary resuscitation until Firefighters/Paramedics arrived on scene. Death was determined at the scene at 1151 hours. No signs of trauma or foul play were noted.

I was assigned this field call by M. Lee on 09/07/2018 at approximately 1300 hours. I arrived on scene at approximately 1402 hours and cleared from the scene at approximately 1605 hours.

During the course of my investigation, the mode of this case was changed from accident versus natural to accident. Foul play is not suspected.

The decedent's fingerprint return and a routine search of Los Angeles County Consolidated Criminal History Report System revealed an alcohol related offense in 2018.

Forensic Attendant L. Bigu transported the decedent from the scene to the Forensic Science Center on 09/07/2018 at approximately 1641 hours.

alcohol, non-prescribed medication (specifically Xanax and unspecified opiates), and cocaine. He said that the decedent struggles with sobriety and when he "slips" he consumes them in excess. He stated that the decedent had several recent "slips", the most recent being on 09/04/2018, when he reportedly consumed alcohol and non-prescribed opiates.

I spoke with Officer Juarez from the Los Angeles Police Department North Hollywood Division at the scene and he related the following information:

On 09/07/2018 at approximately 1159 hours Officers were dispatched to the previously mentioned location in regards to an unresponsive male. Officers arrived on scene and located Firefighters/Paramedics present and the decedent lying supine on the floor of the bedroom. Death had been determined at the scene by Los Angeles Fire Department Paramedic Greer #39744 at 1151 hours, prior to Officers' arrival. An empty bottle of alcohol was noted near the decedent. According to Officers, what appeared to be illicit drugs were located in the residence as well. There were no signs of forced entry into the home. The decedent's valuables were seemingly all present and undisturbed. Foul play is not suspected.

I spoke with the decedent's mother, via telephone and she related the following:

stated that she is the decedent's biological mother. She said that he is not currently

She last spoke with the decedent on the night of 09/06/2018 and said that he appeared to be in good spirits. He seemed very excited about a new album and upcoming tour. She said that the decedent has no medical problems and has never been hospitalized. He was a "heavy smoker" and used tobacco products daily. The decedent had a known history of alcohol and illicit drug abuse. To her knowledge the decedent had never overdosed in the past. The decedent was not diagnosed with any mental health problems and had not displayed any sort of suicidal behavior.

Scene Description:

The scene was a well-furnished single story residence in a residential area. The front door of the residence faced east. Inside the residence was a kitchen to the north, living room to the west, and hallway to the south. A room used as an apparent recording studio was noted at the southernmost point of the hallway. The hallway continued to the west into a master bedroom and bathroom. The studio room contained various recording equipment. A small bag containing a white powdery substance was located on a small table along the north wall of the studio room. On a separate table along the north wall of the studio room an Ipad was noted with linear white powdery residue. An empty bottle of liquor was noted on the desk along the east wall of the studio room. Inside the master bathroom, a bottle of prescription medication prescribed to the decedent was noted. Inside the closet on the west wall of the bathroom, a bag containing a white powdery substance and multiple loose pills were noted inside the pocket of a coat. Inside the master bedroom was a dresser along the east wall, bed along the south wall, piano along the west wall, and television along the north wall. The decedent was noted lying supine on the floor to the east of the bed with his head to the north and his feet to the south. The decedent's lower right leg was noted to be underneath the bed. A rolled 20 dollar bill with a white powdery residue was noted in the right pocket of the decedent's shorts. An empty 750ml bottle of liquor was noted on a nightstand on the west side of the bed.

Evidence:

A white powdery substance, non-prescribed medication, prescription medication, and a rolled 20 dollar bill with white powder residue were collected from the scene and booked into evidence.

Body Examination:

The decedent was an adult, Caucasian man who appeared to be the reported 26 years of age with brown hair, hazel eyes, red beard and mustache, and apparent natural teeth. The decedent was observed lying supine on the floor of a bedroom. White froth and red tinged sputum were noted from the mouth. Tattoos of unknown design were noted to the bilateral sides of the neck. A tattoo of a bird was noted to the chest. A tattoo reading, "We Are Confused" was noted to the abdomen. A tattoo reading, "Rain Or Shine" was noted to the left flank. A tattoo of a clock was noted to the left flank. A tattoo reading, "Most Dope" was noted to the right flank. A tattoo of the state of Pennsylvania was noted to the right flank. Multiple tattoos were noted to the left arm including a flower and characters. A tattoo reading "DOPE" was noted to the left hand.
