Page 1PATHOLOGICAL DIAGNOSES

Perforating gunshot wound to the neck and head with:


- a. Entrance, left lower neck.
- b. Exit, right upper lip.
- c. Partial transection of the left internal carotid artery.
- d. Laceration of the tongue and avulsion of multiple teeth.
- e. Associated hemorrhages.

Perforating gunshot wound to the trunk with:

- a. Entrance, right upper back.
- b. Exit, right upper chest.
- c. Fracture of the right clavicle.
- d. Partial transection of the right subclavian vein.
- e. Associated hemorrhage.

OPINION

48-year old man sustained gunshot wounds at the high school in which s a teacher. He died a short time later at the scene. His death is buted to multiple vascular lacerations due to perforating gunshot s to the neck/head and trunk. Toxicology analysis of body fluids ned at the time o autopsy were negative. In view of the scene and mstances surrounding the death and autopsy findings, the manner of is classified as homicide.
